THE DTC-1 PILOT: AT A GLANCE

A Digital Travel Credential (DTC) might improve passport check processes at airports, while supporting safe and secure borders as well as a smoother travel experience. The DTC 1 Pilot Consortium will run a test with passengers flying with KLM from Canada to the Netherlands to learn how a DTC may be used.

The pilot is open to travelers with a Dutch, Belgian or Canadian passport, flying from Canada to the Netherlands.

This pilot is co-funded by the European Commission.



DTC-1 Pilot

Provides insights to improve security, privacy, efficiency and comfort for travelers, airline staff and border police.



DTC created in advance

Jane installs a dedicated app and creates her DTC. She gives her consent to temporarily share her DTC with KLM Airlines and the Dutch border police. She fills out the border control entry questionnaire.

DTC applied during Boarding

A camera at the gate pairs Jane's face to the photo in her DTC to verify a match. She taps her passport on the scanner to verify she has the authentic document.

Pilot results will provide insights towards a smoother travel journey and will be presented to the European Commission by the consortium.
